RELIEF DISTRIBUTION

1. Local Development Project

Centre for Resource Management and Community Development (CeReMCoD) has distributed relief materials to 27 family members affected by Manipur communal violence. Special package for pregnant women and infants.

2. Relief on Houses affected by fire.

There were three instances of houses destroyed by fire during the year 2023-2024.

- i. On 5th april 2023, Mr. Thangkholun, a resident of M Lhahvom, Churachandpur, his house was completely burnt down by fire (the cause of fire was unknown) leaving everthing inside the house into ashes. The victim family was visited by the organization members the next day and were given Rs.5000/- as consolation and encouragement. A word of prayer was said to console the victim's family, encouraging them to be strong during their times of difficulties.
- ii. In another fateful fire incident, the house of Mr Haominlal of Thinghibung, Leimata, Manipur was burnt down on 2nd April 2023. An amount of Rs.5000/- was handed to the victim family as a token of love and to show that the organisation also bear their loss. This little amount of relief money are given to victim's family by members so that the victims could rehabilitate themselves their immediate needs in their difficult and misery times.
- iii. Another incident of fire happened on the 10th of april 2024 in which the house of Elder Seikam Singsit a settler of Lhangnom Village, Jiribam was burnt down by the fire where half of the property in the house was unable to be taken out. To show our grief and helping hands to the victim's family, an amount of Rs.5000/- was given to the victim family.



3. Relief on Houses destroyed by destructive winds.

About 18 houses were destroyed during the 2023-2024 term, due to the yearly monsoon strong ghaat of winds, believed to be a tornado. Every year the month of May with its strong and violent winds had destructive impact to the lower class people especially who are living in the hill areas with kuccha houses. 14 houses from K.Songgjang, Leimata, one from O Songlung, Churachandpur and three houses from Henglep area were greatly affected by the monsoon winds. Each houses were provided with relief money of Rs.5000/-



4. Relief given to IDPS.

In May 2023, violent clashes between two communities erupted in India's Manipur state, leaving entire villages burned and displacing tens of thousands. The Displaced individuals are sheltered in more than 80 Relief Camps where basic necessities are provided and look after by civil and humanitarian organisations. CeReMCoD also helped in various ways for the Internally Displaced Persons in terms of providing aid and relief materials. Medical Camps were conducted, distribution of food supplies, distribution of sanitary napkins and clothes for daily wear, etc were organised during August 2023- December 2023.



SKILLS DEVELOPMENT TRAINING

1. Electrician Training.

A one-month intensive training programme on Domestic Electrical Wiring and installation was successfully organised by CeReMCoD in collaboration with NESEED during April 2023. The programme equipped 30 trainees with comprehensive knowledge and practical skills in basic electrical wiring, installation techniques, maintenance and safety procedures. The training was specifically designed to enhance the employability,



enabling them to pursue sustainable livelihood opportunities in the electrical sector. Upon successful completion of the training, Certificate were awarded to all participants in recognition of their dedication and achievement. The trainees were provided with completion certificates recognised under skills India and PMKVY, which significantly support them in securing employment opportunities and advancing their professional careers in the future.

2. Tailoring Training

A six month comprehensive Tailoring Training Programme was successfully conducted by CeReMCoD from September 2023- February 2024 with the objective of empowering individuals through vocational skill development and sustainable livelihood opportunities. A total of 15 trainees actively participated in the programme and received intensive training in basic tailoring techniques, garment stitching, patternmaking, fabric cutting, measurement techniques, finishing and machine handling.



The training programme concluded successfully with active participation and commendable dedication from all trainees. Upon completion, certificates were awarded to the participants in recognition of their successful completion of the course. The initiative has significantly contributed towards strengthening livelihood opportunities and promoting skill based empowerment within the community.

Case Study

1. Miss Lhingjahat of K.Salbung was a trainee of Tailoring Training conducted in collaboration with NESEED Foundation. After Completing her 6 months basic course, she went for designer training and now she is a very accomplished tailor having started her own tailor shop in N.Boljang. She also teaches part time at different training centres in Churachandpur. Miss. Lhingjahat used to be an unemployed youth with no income, but after completing her tailoring training she has become one of the notable tailor in the locality with having good customer reviews and her teaching styles is very much appreciated by the students. She has earned a pretty good amount of income from both teaching and taking orders from customers.
